Advent is a Spiritual Discipline:

Do you find it difficult to separate yourself and your family from the Christmas mania happening in Advent? The season of Advent invites us to step away from the hysteria and into a holy wilderness.

Wilderness seasons are significant in the life of God's chosen people. The Israelites wandered in the desert for forty years before entering the Promised Land. God was silent for 400 years before the birth of Christ. Jesus fasted for forty days before beginning his public ministry. We need to experience seasons of wilderness too. Seasons of waiting and seasons of wandering can be uncomfortable, but God uses them to accomplish subtle work in our hearts, building muscles of discipline, patience, and faithfulness, readying us for what is to come. This year our parish will offer a number of ways to spiritually celebrate the season of Advent – both through face to face and "zoom" Advent reflections. Details will follow in the weeks to come.
