Franciscan Reflection:

We need water in its uncontaminated state. It is essential for our survival and for plants and animals. St Francis of Assisi, the Patron of Ecology describes water as "very useful, humble, precious and chaste (pure)." He is spot on! The usefulness of water depends on its purity. We all have the responsibility to prevent its contamination and exploitation. We can learn how St Francis related to this precious resource. He (a creation of God) sees water also as a creation of God. With the same origin - God the Creator, he identifies water, "aqua" a feminine word in Italian, as his sister. With a Common Home, St Francis (representing humanity) and Sister Water both have a reciprocal role to play in each other's lives.

Today, we celebrate World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. The theme of Pope Francis' Message for this occasion is: "Hope and act with Creation." Our Holy Father invites us not to be indifferent to Sister Water, for example, but to "hope and act with" her. We need to do all in our means to keep her "very useful, humble, precious and chaste (pure)." — Fr John Nguyen ofmcap
