Observing the Anniversary of the Dedication

If you ask anyone about the annual traditions of the church, most people go straight to Christmas and Easter. The Catholic liturgical calendar anchors us in God's great story, calling us to remember together the work God has done for us. The church year guided us in a yearlong meditation on God's redemptive love. Every year, we journey through the history of God's people, the life of Christ, and the work of the Holy Spirit. And every year, we also celebrate the dedication of our Church building of the Good Shepherd — a place where we gather to worship God.

It is just right that we give thanks for this occasion in our parish. For Catholics, Churches are built to honour God. Catholic Churches are no ordinary buildings. They are specifically consecrated and set aside for the worship of the True God alone. He is truly present on the Altar and in the Tabernacle. The building itself is very important because it is a place which has been set apart as the house of God and should be treated with great reverence and respect. And we should visit them and pray before our Lord present in the Tabernacle whenever possible. Honour God by honouring that which is consecrated to Him. Honour your parishes and help us build up the kingdom of God brick by brick as we rediscover our venerable traditions.

Some History

Early Christians gathered in homes to celebrate the Eucharist, or Mass. They obeyed Jesus' command of the Last Supper: 'Do this in memory of me' (Luke 22:19)

There were times of persecution for followers of Jesus. In some places, they gathered over tombs of martyrs to celebrate the Eucharist. Martyrs had given their lives rather than deny their faith, and were seen as models for Christians.

However, in places where Christians were relatively safe, they gathered in larger Church buildings. The first recorded Church dedication was in 314 in the city of Tyre. This was one year after the Edict of Milan, when the Emperor Constantine stopped the persecutions of Christians.

Scripture Reading

1 Chronicles 29: 10-13; 15-19

Then David blessed the Lord in the presence of all the assembly; David said: "Blessed are you, O Lord, the God of our ancestor Israel, forever and ever. Yours, O Lord, are the greatness, the power, the glory, the victory, and the majesty; for all that is in the heavens and on the earth is yours; yours is the kingdom, O Lord, and you are exalted as head above all. Riches and honour come from you, and you rule over all. In your hand are power and might; and it is in your hand to make great and to give strength to all. And now, our God, we give thanks to you and praise your glorious name.

For we are aliens and transients before you, as were all our ancestors; our days on the earth are like a shadow, and there is no hope. O Lord our God, all this abundance that we have provided for building you a house for your holy name comes from your hand and is all your own. I know, my God, that you search the heart, and take pleasure in uprightness; in the uprightness of my heart I have freely offered all these things, and now I have seen your people, who are present here, offering freely and joyously to you. O Lord, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, our ancestors, keep forever such purposes and thoughts in the hearts of your people, and direct their hearts toward you. Grant to my son Solomon that with single mind he may keep your commandments, your decrees, and your statutes, performing all of them, and that he may build the temple for which I have made provision."

Franciscan Reflection

This Thursday evening, on 03 October, Franciscans throughout the world including the Capuchins Friars in Plumpton will gather for a special celebration called the **Transitus** (a liturgy celebrating the passing of St Francis from this world to eternal life). All are welcome to the Friary Garden at 7:30 pm.

The emotions of those witnessing St Francis dying were mixed. Some of his followers sang the Canticle of Brother Sun, comforted the Saint with the Gospel of John and sought forgiveness before being orphaned; one of them was more concerned about the ruckus and relocated the Saint; Lady Jacoba desperate to see the Saint for one last time rushed to the scene with all that was needed for burial and a box of almond biscuits (St Francis had a sweet tooth). For Saint Francis, however, although in pain and blind, he was full of joy and was singing. Sister Death was a welcomed guest because he knew he did God's will on earth and will continue joyfully singing forever in Heaven where he would meet His Saviour.
