36th Anniversary of the Dedication of The Good Shepherd Church

"The anniversary of a Church's dedication is celebrated with the rank of a solemnity."

- Roman Pontifical, Rite of Dedication of a Church, 27.

Next weekend 26 & 27 October—at all Masses, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Anniversary of the Dedication of The Good Shepherd Church. The annual celebration of a parish Church's dedication outranks even most Sundays of the Church's liturgical year. The true beauty of the Church, of course, the baptized members of the Mystical Body of Christ, of which our Church building is an important symbol and has an important function. It is here in this building that we are formed to be the Church living and receiving His saving Sacraments. Jesus is the Head and we, the baptized, are the Body (1 Cor. 12:12-26). Be who you are called to be – Jesus Christ!

In the rite of the Dedication of a Church from the Roman rite it says, "Through His death and resurrection, Christ became the true and perfect temple of the New Covenant and gathered a people to be his own. This holy people, made one as the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are one, is the Church, that is, the temple of God built of living stones, where the Father is worshipped in spirit and truth. Rightly, then, from early times 'Church' has also been the name given to the building in which the Christian community gathers to hear the Word of God, to pray together, to receive the Sacraments, and to celebrate the Eucharist. Because the Church is a visible building, it stands as a special sign of the pilgrim Church on earth and reflects the Church dwelling in heaven."

Scripture Readings:

1 Corinthians 3:9-11; 16-17

- ⁹ For we are God's coworkers, working together; you are God's field, God's building.
- ¹⁰ According to the grace of God given to me, like a wise master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building on it. Let each builder choose with care how to build on it. ¹¹ For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ.
- ¹⁶ Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? ¹⁷ If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple.

Ephesians 2:19-22

¹⁹ So then, you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, ²⁰ built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone; ²¹ in him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord, ²² in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.

1 Peter 2:4-9

- ⁴ Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵ like living stones let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For it stands in scripture:
- "See, I am laying in Zion a stone,
- a cornerstone chosen and precious,
- and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."
- ⁷This honour, then, is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe,
- "The stone that the builders rejected
- has become the very head of the corner,"
- ⁸ and "A stone that makes them stumble and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

⁹ But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the excellence of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

May the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, and her most chaste spouse, St Joseph intercede for us always, to guard us and to guide us to their Son, the Good Shepherd, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, so that by His Holy Cross, we may know and see His redemption of all the world, to know through our pilgrim life on this earth, the grace of the holy sacrifice of the Mass and the Sacraments so that, one day, we, too, might come to live in the eternal house of God and join forever with the Angels and the Saints in the liturgy of heaven.
