Readings for next weekend — SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First reading: 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23; Second reading: 1 Corinthians 15:45-49; Gospel: Luke 6:27-38;

The *Canticle of the Creatures* was composed at three distinct moments in the life of St Francis of Assisi. This week we will reflect on the first part.

In a hut on the grounds of San Damiano in Assisi, Francis dictated his praise to God for the sun, moon, wind, water and fire. By naming them as his brothers and sisters, he was conveying his deep perception that we have a common Father. All animated and inanimate creatures share the same Father in heaven consciously or unconsciously.

In Genesis, God used the material elements of creation to make Adam – thereby encapsulating the world in man. Then, God instructed Adam "to cultivate and take care of the Garden of Eden," both the physical garden and implicitly, the garden that is his body. By following these same instructions, we also praise God, Our Creator and we become relational as creatures who share the same Father.
