The Mission of the Church

As we approach the coming Feast of the Ascension it is worthwhile reflecting on the Church's Mission. Before his death Jesus asked his friends to remember him and his vision, in and through the meal he shared with them on the night before he died. Alive in the Holy Spirit, the Church continues to live Jesus' ongoing life and story through the liturgy of the Eucharist. The Eucharist is therefore a sacrifice, a sacred meal, and the renewal of the new and everlasting covenant, in all of which the presence and memory of Christ is celebrated by the Communion of believers as a sign to the world of the Kingdom of God.

Through our baptism we enter the body of Christ and the communion of the Church, and are invited to love as he loved. And because Christ and the Holy Spirit live in us we must go out on mission to the world as Christ did, bringing the presence of Christ into the lives of people, together with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We must be models of Christ and the Holy Spirit for all to see.

We do this by (1) by being a people of prayer. Because God the Father was the very centre of Christ's life – his passion for the Father consumed every moment of his life. (2) Following Christ also means being concerned about the larger issues of life. Love for others is empty if we are not concerned about their needs. Concern for the environment must also be a priority, not merely out of selfish regard for our own future, but out of concern for denerations still to come.

The Holy spirit is the life-giving person of the Trinity. If the Holy Spirit dwells within us we too must become life-givers as the Spirit is. Moreover when we allow the Spirit to fill our lives we begin to live the life of Christ himself. We are on mission with God's Holy Spirit when we allow the Spirit dwelling in us to enter the lives of others with 'love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control' (Galatians 5:22).
