Pentecost is next weekend

The great season of Easter comes to a conclusion with the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem. What began at the Easter Vigil is brought to its conclusion with this celebration.

Oftentimes when we talk about the paschal mystery, we define it as the death and resurrection of Jesus. However it is perhaps more accurate to say that the paschal mystery includes the conception, life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus, as well as the descent of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit unites all things to Christ, including the modern-day efforts of the Church on earth.

The Church embodies the mission of Christ, which is the sole reason for her existence. After the pattern of Jesus' own love, we move beyond ourselves, preaching and witnessing to the reign of God. By the grace of the Holy Spirit, our work shares in and continues the work of Jesus.

The Good News we preach does not belong to us but to the Lord. When the Church focuses too much on her survival, her popularity, or even her perfection, she forgets Christ's mission. The Good News is not meant to be rationed or hidden, because the Holy Spirit is bestowed on individuals for the sake of the entire people of God.

The Holy Spirit empowers us to live the Good News and to draw others to know Christ and the Good News. Make a friend, be a friend, bring a friend to Christ. Who will you invite to come with you to Mass next weekend to celebrate Pentecost? Start praying now for that person you have in mind.
