Franciscan Reflection

"For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross" (Col 1:19-20).

This weekend we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered. He reconciled "all things to himself." He restored broken relationships not only between humans but the entire creation (all things), which have suffered due to the effects of sin. Jesus did not limit Himself to us, but extended the scope of reconciliation to include the entire universe.

Discipleship includes following and imitating Jesus Christ. Therefore, we are called to reconcile relationships between ourselves and all of God's creation. The state of the earth has deteriorated since The Fall with the majority of the damage done in more recent centuries. We have inherited this destruction. Surely, it is something we don't want to pass on to future generations. It is our responsibility to restore harmony and order according to our respective states in life and within our means.

When peace is lacking, both the people in our lives or the current condition of the environment in which we live can be some of the crosses we carry. Let us restore these broken relationships. When it comes to the latter, it is a difficult and necessary task to transform ourselves in order to reduce consumption and live more sustainably. We carry our crosses when we deny ourselves and willingly accept hardships, sacrifice and suffering in following Jesus.
